T. CONGRESS OF THE PHILIPPINES

A. SENATE

MANDATE

As provided under the 1987 Constitution of the Philippines, the Senate, together with the House of the Representatives (HREP), make up the Congress of the Philippines which is vested with the legislative powers.

The major functions of the Senate are the following:

- 1. The Congress, by a vote of two-thirds of both Houses in joint session assembled, voting separately, shall have the sole power to declare the existence of a state of war. (Paragraph 1, Section 23, Article VI)
- 2. Mithin forty-eight (48) hours from the proclamation of martial law or the suspension of the privilege of the writ of habeas corpus, the President shall submit a report in person or in writing to the Congress. The Congress, voting jointly, by a vote of at least a majority of its Members in regular or special session, may revoke such proclamation or suspension, which revocation shall not be set aside by the President. Upon the initiative of the President, the Congress may, in the same manner, extend such proclamation or suspension for a period to be determined by the Congress, if the invasion or rebellion shall persist and public safety requires it. (Paragraph 1, Section 18, Article VII)
- 3. No treaty or international agreement shall be valid and effective unless concurred in by at least two-thirds of all the Members of the Senate. (Section 21, Article VII)
- 4. Determines by a two-thirds vote of both Houses, voting separately, that the President is unable to discharge the powers and duties of his office, the Vice-President shall act as President; otherwise, the President shall continue exercising the powers and duties of his office. (Paragraph 4, Section 11, Article VII)
- 5. The Senate shall have the sole power to try and decide all cases of impeachment. (Paragraph 6, Section 3, Articles XI)

A Senate that is independent, fair and fearless; a government institution that zealously protects the Constitution, promotes democratic values and upholds the national interest.

Special Provisions Applicable to the Congress of the Philippines

- 1. Augmentation of Any Item in the Appropriations of the Congress of the Philippines. Pursuant to Section 25(5) of Article VI of the Constitution, the Senate President, with respect to the Senate and the Commission on Appointments, the Speaker, with respect to the House of Representatives, and the Chairpersons of the Senate and the House of Representatives Electoral Tribunals, are hereby authorized to augment any item in the general appropriations law for their respective offices from any savings in other items of their respective appropriations.
- 2. Organizational Structure of the Senate, the House of Representatives, the Senate and House of Representatives Electoral Tribunals and the Commission on Appointments. Any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding and within the limits of the appropriations authorized in this Act, the Senate President, with respect to the Senate and the Commission on Appointments, the Speaker, with respect to the House of Representatives and the Chairpersons of the Senate and House of Representatives Electoral Tribunals, are authorized to formulate and implement the organizational structures of their respective offices, to fix and determine the salaries, allowances and other benefits of their respective Members, employees and consultants, subject to Section 10, Article VI of the Constitution, and whenever public interest so requires, make adjustments and reorganization of positions in the regular personnel with the corresponding transfer of items of appropriations or create new ones in their respective offices: PROVIDED, That officers and employees whose positions are affected by such adjustments or reorganization shall be granted retirement gratuities and separation pay in accordance with existing laws, which shall be payable from any unexpended balance of, or savings in the appropriations of their respective offices: PROVIDED, FURTHER, That the foregoing changes, reorganization and modifications shall be submitted to the DBM for proper documentation.

- 3. Release of Appropriations. Appropriations authorized for the Congress of the Philippines shall be automatically and regularly released to the Senate, the House of Representatives, the Senate and House of Representatives Electoral Tribunals, and the Commission on Appointments, as the case may be.
- 4. Realignment of Allocation for Operational Expenses. Subject to the approval of the Senate President or the Speaker of the House of Representatives, as the case may be, a Member of Congress may realign his allocation for operational expenses to any other expense category: PROVIDED, That the total of said allocation is not exceeded.
- 5. Apropriations for Programs and Specific Activities. The amounts appropriated herein for the programs of the Congress of the Philippines shall be used specifically for the activities in the amounts indicated under the Details of the FY 2014 Budget attached as Annex A (Volume 1) of this Act.
